Panel Debate: Packaging & Packaging Waste Regulation proposal

FEDIAF members were honoured to be joined by an expert panel:

- Dr Wolfgang Trunk, Policy Officer at DG ENVI, European Commission
- Caroline Ploux, Mars Senior Manager Public Affairs Europe
- Delia Harabula, Sustainability Advocacy Lead EMEA at Amcor

Dr Trunk gave an insightful presentation on the EU Packaging & Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR) proposal. Trunk confirmed that it is: "An ambitious policy package". He confirmed that it is indispensable to deliver on the Green Deal objectives, while increasing the economic efficiency in the packaging value chain."

Presentations were followed by an excellent Q&A session moderated by Sean Goulding Carroll, a journalist at Euractiv. The panel debated how the Industry could navigate the challenges and best prepare for a circular future.

FEDIAF, the European Pet Food Association, welcomes the European Commission's proposal on the revision of the Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR).

Pet food packaging is critical to ensure pet foor is kept safe and retains its nutritional quality Packaging also provides pet owners with important factual and legal information abou

Pet food packaging comes in a variety of formats including pouches, cans, bags and trays. There an different materials used in their formulation ranging from paper and cardboard to plastic and aluminium. Manufacturers carefully select the bes option in order to ensure freshness, hygiene, safet, and sustainability.

FEDIAF members are fully committed to reducing the environmental impact of pet food packaging. The pet food industry has been making progress to reduce and optimise the use of packaging from PPWR that will ensure pet food safety, essential to the health and welfare of over 300 million pets in the EU, alongside broader policy objectives aiming to harmonise rules and minimising packaging and packaging waste.

initiative, and we welcome the overall ambition of the proposed Packaging and Packaging Wast Regulation. We strongly support:

- Article 4, which stresses on the importance free movement of packaging across the EU.
- Article 11.1, which sets up harmonised sortin labels across the EU, allowing consumers t properly sort their packaging which wi contribute to improving recycling rates.
- Article 6, which supports the development of harmonised definition of 'recyclable packagin at EU level.
- Article 43, which mandates for all package (including flexibles) to be collected.

Across Europe, there are approximately 150 pet companies producing 10.2 million tonnes of pet food, which is provided to many of the 90 million curpopan house/holds benefiting from the love and companisoship of their 300million pets. There are around 110 million cats, 90 million dogs, 50 million birds, 30 million small mammals, 16 million aguaria and 11 million reptain.

In Europe, there are an estimated 110,000 people directly employed and 950,000 indirectly employed through the net food industry.

FEDIAF promotes pet food that contributes to the health and wellbeing of pets. It is the voice of the European pet food industry and collaborates with authorities, regulators and academics and civil society to achieve favourable conditions for the sunply of safe, nutritious and nalatable products.
